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Who is Who in the Fall of Babylon: A Prophetic Letter.

While the world remains fixated on the chaotic noise of shifting global policies and the rising heat of international conflict, the true signal is undeniable: America's spiritual and sovereign stock is in a total freefall. Other nations no longer see a global policeman; they see a vulnerable corporate opportunity—a market expansion waiting to be claimed. Adversaries are no longer afraid of the "sword" because they believe the arm holding it has gone limp. We are witnessing the living breath of Revelation 13:10. The sword once swung by this nation is now being sharpened for its own neck, demanding a level of endurance from the saints that few are prepared to give.

To truly grasp the weight of Revelation 13:10, we must look through a dual lens. Historically, this mandate mirrors the prototype of the Israelites in Egypt—a people led into physical captivity by a world power. This anchor is why some Hebrew Israelite camps interpret this prophecy as a promise of future physical vengeance. They identify African Americans—the descendants of those brought here via the Transatlantic Slave Trade—as the true Israelites, and view the Caucasian descendants who were the enslavers as the biblical "Esau/Edom." Under this view, they believe that those who once held the chains will one day be placed in them. However, a deeper look at the conclusion of that verse—the patience and faith of the saints—suggests a spiritual reality that transcends both physical skin and bloodlines.

While the chains of Egypt are a matter of history, the spiritual chains of Babylon are a matter of the present heart. The word is clear: a man can be physically free but spiritually incarcerated. Jesus warned in John 8:34 that whosoever committeth sin is the servant of sin; and as 2 Peter 2:19 confirms, people are slaves to whatever has mastered them. This is the true captivity—a legal transfer of the soul's loyalty to whatever has conquered it. The word warns in Proverbs 5:22 that the cords of sin hold a man fast, and as Psalm 9:16 confirms, we are often ensnared by the very work of our own hands. This proves that we become the property of our own actions and indulgences. This is why the exodus must begin within.

The mandate of the exodus is not merely a change of geography, but a radical change of the yoke. Galatians 5:1 commands believers to stand fast in liberty and not be entangled again with the yoke of bondage. To "come out" of Babylon while remaining tied to the cords of iniquity is a spiritual impossibility. In the realm of the spirit, you are defined by the master you serve; Matthew 6:24 says no man can serve two masters. Therefore, the "patience of the saints" is found in the endurance of the soul, not in the systemic power structure of Pharaoh.

Physical Egypt, Spiritual Babylon: The Final Exodus

To understand the mechanics of this national collapse, we must look at the blueprint found in the Book of Daniel. Many scholars identify the "feet of iron and clay" in Nebuchadnezzar's dream as the final iteration of world power—a fragile coalition that perfectly mirrors the internal fracturing of the United States. This is the modern "Babylon," a kingdom held together by force but divided in its soul.

Its identification sets the stage for Revelation 18:2, where the decree is finalized: "Babylon the great has fallen... and has become a dwelling place of demons, a prison for every foul spirit." The warning in verse 4 is no longer a suggestion; it is a strategic evacuation order: "Come out of her, my people, that ye be not partakers of her sins." This vision describes a total systemic failure—a collapse that occurs in a single day, leaving the global kings who profited from her standing in shock at the empty shells of their investments.

To understand the depth of this divine warning, we must draw a parallel between the angel's conversation with Lot in Genesis 19:12 and the call to exit Babylon. Just as the angels asked Lot if he had any family to bring out of the city, there is a specific search underway for those who belong to the covenant. However, this "family search" is symbolic; it represents those "sealed with the Holy Spirit of promise" (Ephesians 1:13).

To be clear: a biological connection does not guarantee a covenant relationship. If it did, a family member practicing witchcraft would be saved simply because their cousin is filled with the Holy Spirit. The Bible says in 2 Corinthians 6:16, "What agreement has the temple of God with idols?" As the Apostle Paul reminded us in Philippians 2:12, we must each work out our own salvation with fear and trembling. The exit is not a group rate; it is a personal response to a heavenly mandate.

Discernment in the Hour of Matthew 24

In this hour of systemic liquidation, the signal is no longer a distant warning; it is a present reality. We have seen how the physical Egypt of our history has transitioned into the spiritual Babylon of our current soul-condition. To survive the "one day" collapse of this global enterprise, we must move beyond the vanity of bloodlines and the noise of political warfare.

The true exodus requires radical repentance—a turning away from the internal masters of sin that have kept us in a captivity far more dangerous than any physical chain. We must petition the heavens for an increase in discernment, because the spiritual landscape is currently flooded with high-level deception. As Matthew 24:24 warns, the final days will see the rise of false prophets and "signs and wonders" so calculated that, if it were possible, they would deceive the very elect.

If your discernment is not sharpened by the Holy Spirit, you will mistake the signs of the adversary for the wonders of the kingdom. The time has come to ensure that your identity is found in the seal of promise and not in the "iron and clay" of a falling empire. The call to "come out" is personal, it is urgent, and it is the only exit strategy that holds eternal value.
